

**Children's International Lifeline

**About Us:**

Children's International Lifeline is a non-profit mission that ministers to poverty stricken people of the world, primarily in the country of Haiti. Lifeline's reach is gradually extending to other places in the world, but Haiti is where God first planted the seeds of love and compassion that germinated and grew into this charitable organization.

**Our Programs:**

- **Education Program** - Children's International Lifeline aids fifty different orphanages and schools that provide an education for approximately 5,500 children. Children's International Lifeline fully sponsors eleven schools in Haiti at the present time. The annual school year is from October to July. These schools are called "primary" schools. The classes are from Kindergarten 1, which is equivalent to Preschool in the United States, to sixth grade. The schools have teachers that continually enhance their education with teacher trainings. 100% of the sixth graders passed the national standardized test given by the Haitian government. The schools teach Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Geography, Science, among other subjects.
- **Feeding Program** - Lifeline now has 50 different feeding locations that provide a hot nutritious meal for approximately 8,200 children five days a week.
- **Formula Program** - Many babies were dying before they could get to the solid foods. Lifeline began a formula program in 2007 to meet this vital need. This program provides mothers that are unable to breast feed with baby formula to properly nourish their infants.
- **Medical Program** - Lifeline opened a fully functional medical clinic in February of 2008. The clinic is staffed with one doctor, two nurses, and a receptionist. This clinic is fully funded by Children's International Lifeline. The clinic provides medical care and medicine to the people that are not able to afford it. Approximately 50 - 100 people are cared for daily. A variety of cases are seen from getting stitches for a cut to treating malnutrition, to extreme burns.
- **Church Program** - Lifeline over the last nine years has established and aided the functioning of approximately 70 churches. Haitians are the pastors and it is operated by the people of each individual village. These churches give spiritual guidance to those who need it.
- **Emergency Relief** - Lifeline provides emergency relief such as food, water, water filters, medical care, and clothing in times of natural disasters. In 2011 this organization provided 3 million meals due to the continued humanitarian efforts. We have built and repaired over 20 homes. We have provided over 10,000 gallons of clean water.
- **Love Bundle Program** - This year Lifeline provided about 10,000 Love Bundles which consists of simple gifts such as washcloths, towels, soap, shampoo, toothpaste, toothbrush, clothes, toys, school supplies, peanut butter, and a salvation pamphlet. These are handed out to children throughout Haiti.

- **Team Trip Program** – Each year Lifeline hosts short-term mission teams to Haiti. We hosted 36 teams this year. These teams provide a variety of services to the mission and the country. Some of the services are ministry, feeding children, building schools, building churches, digging deep water wells, handing out Love Bundles, building benches and other furniture, making concrete blocks, working in the medical clinic in a variety of ways, teaching in the schools, as well as other things that are necessary to be done.
- **Church Convention** – Lifeline hosts a yearly church convention. We had over 2,500 Haitians were in attendance with 40 Americans visiting with them. They enjoyed four days of fellowship during services, weddings, baptisms, and sharing in meals and much more.
- **Bread Program** – Because of the lack of food, Lifeline began baking bread in sun ovens several years ago to provide more carbohydrates and nourishment to the children. These “sun ovens” are solar powered ovens that have the capability of baking several loaves of bread at a time. This is a wonderful blessing to the children that have nothing at all to eat.

### Services 2011-2008

#### In 2011 we provided the following services in Haiti:

- Fed approximately 8,300 people 5 days a week a hot nutritious meal. This included 16 containers of rice, beans, specially formulated fortified meals, as well as other necessary food supplies.
- Conducted school from Preschool to 10th grade (the school year runs from August to May). We had 5,500 children in attendance for the 2010-2011 school year.
- Ran a medical clinic that serves the Haitian people. Approximately 100 people a day walked through our doors
- Started a trade school August 2008 that teaches young men and ladies occupations that will allow them to make a living for their families and better their future. We trained 60 in 2011 through our trade school.
- Baked 100's of loaves of bread for children in the villages
- For the past 6 years Lifeline has conducted monthly pastor's trainings to better equip the pastors and congregations. 75 people attended the training.
- Hosted short-term mission teams that allow them to be a part of the culture, programs, and work of the mission. We have hosted 36 short term mission trips throughout the past year which included activities such as constructing homes, planting trees, ministry teams, vacation Bible schools, emergency relief, distribution of food, supplies, & love bundles as well as many other activities. These teams were very productive and life changing for the American participants as well as the Haitians. They help make a positive impact on the country impact on the nation of Haiti.
